

## EVACUATION

Decision for evacuation is taken only by the competent authorities!



- Keep calm - you'll have enough time to evacuate!
- Collect all the members of your family!
- Bring along:
  - Personal documents, valuables and money;
  - Personal care items (soap, towel, toothbrush and toothpaste, etc.);
  - Clothing according to the season (warm clothes);
  - Medicines that use first aid and chronic diseases;
  - Items for children and babies;
  - Portable radio;
  - Other necessary items (flashlight, lighter, pocketknife, travel kit etc.);
- Ensure your food for 2-3 days!
- Turn off electricity, gas and Water doprovd-nata network!
- Lock your home!

First, the way and direction of evacuation will be announced on the radio and siren system.

- If you use your own transport, listen to instructions, head to the dispatch center and plug in the column!

- If you use public transport then you hear the message beginning of the evacuation, quickly move to the nearest bus stop to your house.

## RULES OF CONDUCT FOR RADIATION ACCIDENT

### OBSERVE PERSONAL HYGIENE

Wash your hands thoroughly, especially before eating, Bathe daily. Breathe through your nose and exit - through a mask or damp cloth. Upon entering the home must pull off shoes and coats to download. Keep them separate

### AVOID CONTAMINATION IN YOUR HOME

Children should stay home to clarify the situation. Close the windows and seal them well. Ventilate the only quiet time and then through a window in which you put 3-4 layers of cheese-cloth or other cloth. No sweeping and tapping, daily clean with a damp cloth. When using a vacuum cleaner outlet stream must be filtered out during wet cloth. Wash often clothes and linen, not dry outdoors. Store food in tightly sealed containers, follow the directions for their culinary processing.

### WHEN OUTDOORS

Do not take picnics and walks. Limit trips, especially black and dusty roads. It is often to wash the streets and sidewalks. Do not sweep the yard, dew jet water lawns and round paths around your house. Do not sit on the grass and other green areas. Do not bathe in open reservoirs.

### TREATMENT OF FOOD AND WATER

Do not consume food which has been declared a temporary ban. It is preferable to use available canned food and other durable products. If you need transport of food, place them in plastic bags. Preserving food should be in basements, closets and niches closed or hermetically sealed.

Handle and cook food indoors. Disconnect from your diet leafy vegetables and milk. Relatively safe are greenhouse fruits and vegetables, carrots, potatoes, poultry and pork, as well as ocean fish. Use dry milk daily menu for children. Contaminated food products not subject to thermal treatment, consume only after thoroughly washing with water and further maceration for 24 hours. When cooking boned and cut the meat into pieces to '70, soak it for 24 hours in water (1: 4) and discard the water. Boil the meat and discard the broth first. Water for drinking and household needs are taken only from closed, controlled and authorized for use water sources.

### IN CASE OF RADIOLOGICAL ACCIDENT

- Follow the specific instructions of the Ministry of Interior - General Directorate "Fire Safety and Population Protection" and the police.
- Comply with the recommendations of the Ministry of Health. If there is a solution for iodine prophylaxis, take iodine tablets given your schedule.
- Be prepared to be evacuated and watch out for the purpose of filing the corresponding signal. Place in plastic bags identity documents, money, medicine, portable values set outerwear, food for two or three days, drinking water.
- If your home room suitable for shelter immediately borrow it, and in the absence of shelter take measures for sealing doors and windows.
- Consume only durable and canned products.
- Limit leaving the home, and if necessary, use a mask with filter for radioactive iodine dust masks, gauze dressings.
- After a stay outdoors remove shoes and coats and store them separately.
- Observe the rules of personal hygiene.

## PROTECTIVE MEASURES FOR INCREASED RADIOACTIVITY

### IODINE PROPHYLAXIS

Iodine prophylaxis is carried out only after an order by the Ministry of Health!

- Specify pre nearest point to form tablets of potassium iodide.
- Before attempting to iodine prophylaxis, carefully read the user manual!

### CAUTION!

Iodine prophylaxis does not remove the necessity of implementing all other measures to protect!

### PERSONAL PROTECTION EQUIPMENT

Individual protection means (IPM) are:

- Civilian gas mask;
- Children's mask;
- Respirator;
- Child protective chamber.
- Check in advance you have your family with individual remedies.
- If you do not seek such by the municipality or the Regional Service "Fire Safety and Population Protection".
- Prepare the available satellites.
- If at the time of the accident do not have satellites, use cotton gauze dressing moistened handkerchief or cotton cloth with which better to close the mouth and nose!
- Use protection clothes made of thick fabric, and rubber coated fabrics, polyethylene sheets.
